As a diocese, we will soon participate in an Ash Wednesday collection for Catholic Charities of Acadiana. The focus of this year's collection is preventing hunger.

No family or individual should experience hunger. Hunger is an emergency, one where our faith compels us to respond. With this core belief, Catholic Charities of Acadlana operates St. Joseph Diner and FoodNet Food Bank.

Through both core programs, Catholic Charities of Acadiana responds with compassion to thousands who experience hunger and food insecurity throughout the eight civil parishes of the Diocese of Lafayette.

Last year, St. Joseph Diner prepared and distributed over 186,918 meals. FoodNet Foodbank distributed over 41,152 food bags to neighbors in need through partner pantries across the region.

St. Joseph Diner and FoodNet Food Bank are largely donor-funded programs. Your generous support of the Ash Wednesday second collection will help us purchase food and provide immediate relief to someone in our community.
