LENTEN REGULATIONS-All Fridays of Lent are obligatory days of abstinence- (means we do not eat meat). The law of fast binds everyone from age 18-59. Good Friday is an obligatory day of fast and abstinence-means we have only one full meal a day. Two lighter meals are permitted. We do not eat meat this day also. The law of abstinence binds from age 14 and older. Those that are excused are the physically and mentally ill including those suffering from chronic illness, diabetes, pregnant or nursing mothers.

Reflection on the Gospel- In today's gospel, the crowd reminds Jesus about the tragedy of a group of Galileans who became sacrificial offerings at the hands of Pilate's henchman, Jesus recognizes the unspoken question: Big sinners, big suffering? and answers with an explicit No. He himself reminds them of eighteen people killed when a tower collapsed on them. Jesus uses these events to make one point: what happened was sudden, with no time to avoid the catastrophes. But there is a much greater catastrophe: our unpreparedness for the merciful yet just judgment of God. -*Living Liturgy tm, Third Sunday of Lent 2022*
