MASS FOR THIS WEEKEND-Bishop Deshotel is urging everyone to wear masks while attending Weekend and Weekday Masses. *Phase 2-50% occupancy for our church requires a limit of 150 persons at each mass. The Church doors will be opened 30 minutes before mass. Maintain 6 feet safe distancing at all times. There will not be any missalettes in pews. You may bring your copy of Magnificat or Word Among Us but please take home after mass. The Gifts will not be brought up.

For Communion Time- Use hand sanitizer before you receive communion, please bring your own or use bottle in back of church. One row at a time-Parishioners go out one by one with 6 feet distance in between. *Receive Communion in the hands. After mass, please take a bulletin from Usher and exit building with 6 feet distancing. *Parishioners are not to socialize in church. You may visit outside after Mass away from exits and should be encouraged to physically distance and to wear masks.

If you are sick, please attend only when you are well. Also, persons over 65 years old are at a higher risk of experiencing worse symptoms than others if they contact the coronavirus and should consider not attending Mass.

*Phase 2 also-All Catholics in the Diocese of Lafayette remain dispensed from their obligation from attending Sunday Masses until we get word from Bishop Deshotel. The duty to sanctify Sunday should be fulfilled through some other form of devotion, watch mass on television or on the internet, pray the rosary, scripture reading, etc. *Confessions will be heard in Sacristy Room behind Altar from 30 minutes before mass to 10 minutes before mass starts. Go to the Mary Alcove and wait 6 feet apart from others to enter one at a time. If no one is there in line, check to see in Sacristy if anyone is in there with Father.

<u>Prayer to St. Joseph</u>-O St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires. Reflection on the Gospel-Grudges are awful things. But today's gospel calls us to a higher standard. The forgiveness we've experienced should motivate us to be free with forgiveness when others wrong us. We cannot dole out forgiveness in infinitesimal pieces only to those we deem worthy. Instead, forgiveness ought to be given freely. We must die to the grudges, slights, rudeness, and other transgressions we've suffered and rise to a sense of freedom that comes through forgiving as we've been forgiven. Jesus himself warns us that if we withhold forgiveness, it will be withheld from us. And the consequences of that are severe indeed. *Living Liturgy tm, Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2020*

PRAYER FOR HURRICANE SEASON

O God, Master of this passing world, hear the humble voices of your children. The Sea of Galilee obeyed your order and returned to its former quietude; You are still the Master of land and sea. We live in the shadow of a danger over which we have no control: the Gulf, like a provoked and angry giant, can awake from its seeming lethargy, overstep its conventional boundaries, invade our land and spread chaos and disaster. During this hurricane season we turn to You, O loving Father. Spare us from past tragedies whose memories are still so vivid and whose wounds seem to refuse to heal with passing of time.
